issue stamps. These stamps carry a postmark from a location that's relevant to the theme of the stamps being issued.

All new sets of stamps are available as First Day Covers. In 2002 there will be at least 12 Special Stamp sets based on the following themes:

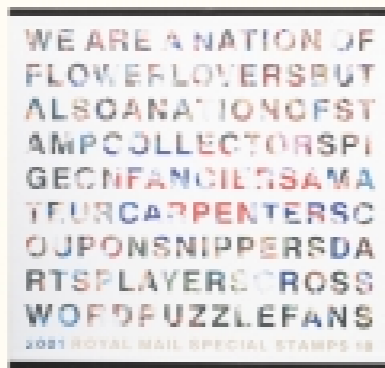

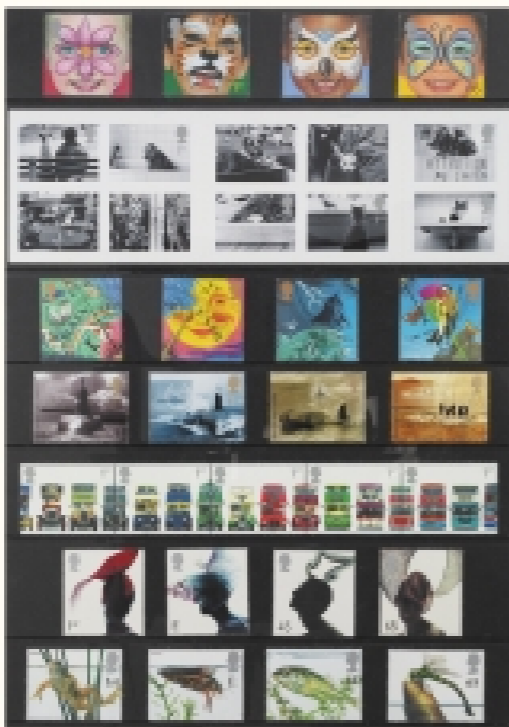

The Yearpack for 2001 contains 12 Special Stamp sets, each dealing with a very different aspect of British life, including a positive view of the future as represented by our children; the British

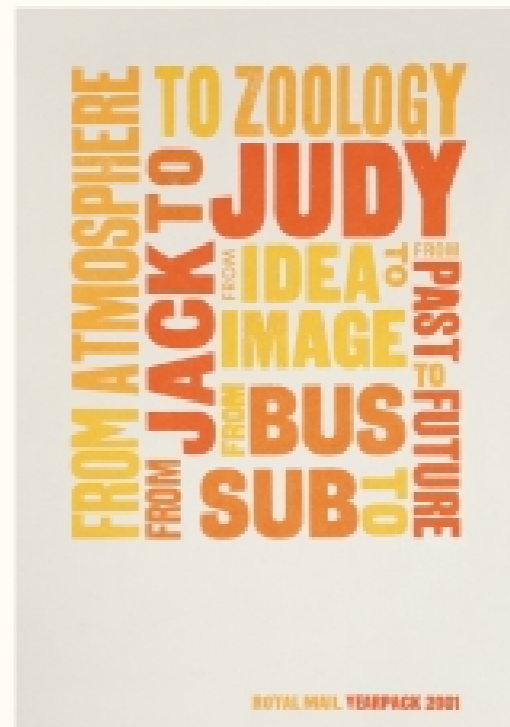
love of cats and dogs; our national obsession with the weather; the Royal Navy Submarine Service, whose centenary we've just commemorated plus the Flags and Ensigns connected with them; the history of our internationally famous buses; the exquisite and elaborate hats designed by contemporary milliners; the extraordinary beauty of our pond life; the colourful tradition of Punch and Judy; the 100th anniversary of the Nobel Prizes, which have honoured so many of Britain's greatest achievers; and finally, a traditional celebration of Christmas with our national

bird, the robin. For more details about all these stamps please turn to pages 8 and 9.

There are some particularly interesting features of 2001's stamps. In the first class Weather stamp, for example, the lower cloud is printed with heat-sensitive ink that changes colour upon being touched.

Also, the Nobel Prizes set (see page 7) incorporates some of the most innovative printing techniques ever used in stamps.

The Flags and Ensigns series commemorates the bicentenary of an important date: the 1801 Act of Union between Great Britain and

Ireland, when the Union Flag was amended to its present design. A miniature sheet features the Union Jack, the White Ensign,

All the Special issues for 2002 are also available as Mint Stamps – uncanceled stamps without postmarks. Mint Stamps

are for those who appreciate them as miniature works of art. And considering the careful planning and original designs that go into our products, the special papers and printing processes that are used, one can easily understand why Royal Mail stamps are treasured around the world.

Limited edition prints by well-known artists from as little as 19p.

Over the years, famous artists such as David Hockney, Gerald Scarfe and Andy Goldsworthy have created stamps for Royal Mail. The dog stamp shown here features work by top photographer Elliott Erwitt, and the Buses series was designed by the renowned illustrator,



Michael English. In 2002, stamps will include work by the illustrator Izhar Cohen, photographs by Lord Snowdon and Karsh of Ottawa and illustrations by



artist/inventor Ron Fuller.

All Royal Mail stamps are created with the same meticulous care. And when it comes to the paper used in the stamps, not just any old wood pulp will do. We normally use a mixture of eucalyptus, Scandinavian pine and birch pulp. Some Special Stamps (the Nobel Prize for Economics, for instance) are printed using a highly skilled engraving technique, called intaglio or recess printing, that leaves the ink slightly raised, giving a feel similar to that of banknotes.

There's a good reason for every stamp.

Since 1964 certain criteria have formed the basis for Special Stamp issues. The purpose of a new set is to:

1. Celebrate events of national and international importance – for example, the first flight of Concorde in 1969 and



International Year of the Child in 1979.

2. Commemorate important anniversaries (usually in multiples of 50 years), such as the centenaries of the birth of Winston Churchill in 1974, the RSPCA in 1990 and cinema in 1996.

3. Reflect the British contribution to world affairs including the arts and sciences. For instance, the 300th anniversary of the Principia Mathematica by Sir Isaac Newton in 1987.
4. Reflect aspects of Britain and the British way of life, such as the Summertime issue in 1994 or, as shown on page 12, the British love of cats and dogs.
5. Extend public patronage of the arts by encouraging the development of

minuscule art.

DEFINITIVE STAMPS

The original postage stamps.

In 1840 Britain produced the world's first adhesive postage stamp, the Penny Black, with Queen Victoria's head as the

main image. Since then, each of our monarchs has been featured in this way on the everyday stamps called Definitives. Interestingly, our nation's stamps are the only ones in the world not to feature their country's name, our monarch's head being a sufficient indication of the country of origin.

There are three kinds of Definitive Stamps available:

- Low Value Definitives – £1 and under.
- High Value Definitives – those over £1.
- Country Definitives.

Low and High Value Definitives have a different colour for each different stamp

value. These stamps normally remain on sale until there is a change in postal rates.

As well as showing the Queen's head, Definitives also celebrate the individual nations of the United Kingdom. Country Definitive Stamps carry national emblems or images which reflect the traditions and

history of each country. Definitives are available for England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland (please see the framed postcard images on page 21).

The English Country Definitives celebrate English national heritage with heraldic symbols which have represented the nation

throughout history. While for Northern Ireland Country Definitives, Royal Mail has used certain aspects of Northern Ireland's geography and culture that are rich in elaborate visual patterns.

Definitive Stamps, generally considered the 'classics' of world stamps, are an excellent starting point for any collector.

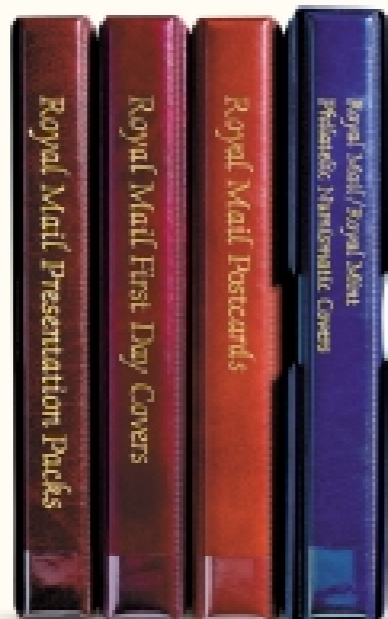

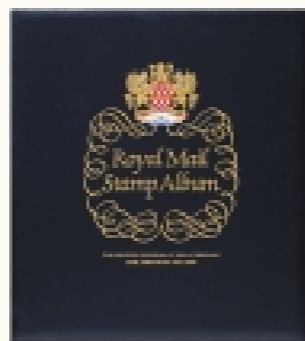

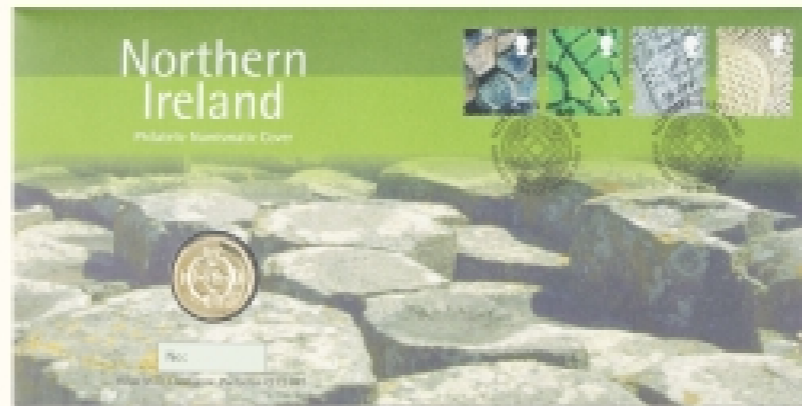

A Coin Cover usually combines a First Day Cover with a coin specially minted by The Royal Mint. The coins are legal tender in their own right and appear on the envelope alongside the stamps.

Each envelope is die-cut to display the coin and carries its own limited edition number. The coin is sealed inside a protective cover between card to keep it in 'brilliant-uncirculated' condition.

As with all Covers, they come complete with fascinating information on the subject they are commemorating. Coin Covers

are released infrequently and could sell out within days. As a subscriber though, you are guaranteed to receive a copy of

each issue and exclusive prior notice of their issue date.

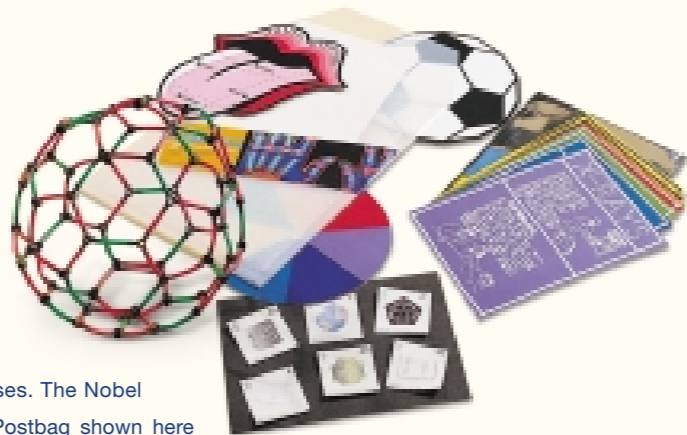

INTERESTING FACTS ABOUT STAMPS!

- In 1840 Britain produced the world's first self-adhesive postage stamp, the Penny Black. As the inventor of the postage stamp, Britain is the only nation which doesn't need to include its name on its stamps; instead, it simply uses the monarch's head.
- The most popular Special Stamps issued were the set produced to commemorate the life of Diana, Princess of Wales – more than 30 million of these were printed.
- By convention, Royal Mail Stamps should not feature any living person other than members of the Royal Family.
- Every year, Royal Mail receives over 2000 nominations for stamp subjects from the British public. Final stamp



designs have to be approved by HM The Queen before they are issued.

- The busiest time of the year for mail is Christmas. Royal Mail prints more than 408 million Christmas stamps each year. The second class stamp is the most popular stamp at this time, with over 165 million produced.
- Royal Mail first issued Special Christmas Stamps in 1966. The pair of stamps (one of them shown below) were designed by two children who won a national competition that was featured on BBC's Blue Peter.
- The gum on the Definitive Stamp contains just 5.9 calories, while a Special Stamp has 14.5 calories.
